

Preparing a Bibliography

A bibliography or references cited is a list of your sources. Alphabetize your sources by author's last name (if given) or by the title.¹

BOOKS: Author or editor (last name first). Title (underlined). City where the book was published: Publisher, copyright date.

Ashby, Ruth and Deborah Gore Ohm, eds. Herstory: Women who changed the World.
New York: Viking 1995.

MAGAZINES: Author (last name first). "Article title". (in quotation marks). Title of the magazine (underlined) Date (day month year): Page numbers of the article.

Markham, Lois. "A Gallery of Great Americans." Kids Discover Aug.-Sep. 1996: 6-7.

ENCYCLOPEDIAS: Author (if available). "Article title" (in quotation marks). Title of the encyclopedia (underlined). Edition or version. Type other than book (CD-ROM, Diskette, etc.) Date published.

INTERNET: Author (if available). "Article title" (in quotation marks). Source title (underlined). Date published. On-line. Internet. Date Found. Available URL (address)

GRAPHIC IMAGES: Description or title of image. On-line. Internet. Date Found. Available URL (address)
