Remember the fun you had on the playground?

Imagine if you had to play in a separate area away from most of your peers.

Children with disabilities who attend Brooklyn Elementary School currently have to play on the paved basketball court a distance away from the playscape and the majority of their peers.

This is about to change.

Parents, teachers, and concerned citizens of Brooklyn, with the support of the Brooklyn PTO, have joined together to raise money to build universally accessible playgrounds at the Brooklyn Elementary School.



Children will be playing side-by-side.

Boundless playgrounds are being built in many towns and cities across the country so that children of ALL abilities can come together and experience the wonder of play in a safe, barrier-free environment – where children can develop their skills and strengths while exploring sensory-rich opportunities through side-by-side play with their friends.

We are working with the National Center for Boundless Playgrounds, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, which helps communities like ours create play environments that address the needs of ALL children including those with physical, sensory or developmental disabilities.



A playground built by the community for the community

This multi-year project is estimated to cost \$200,000 and will depend upon the generous support of individuals, local businesses, corporations, and foundations.

The funds raised will be used to design and build a new section of the existing playground (established in 1995 by the Brooklyn PTO) that will be universally accessible. In addition, the current pre-school playground will be replaced with a new playground that is also universally accessible, in coordination with the pre-school building renovation project already underway.

Volunteers are coming together to make this project a reality. Fundraising events have already been held and plans for more are being formulated. The Committee is also pursuing grants and endowments. Sponsorship opportunities for businesses and organizations are also available for cash and in-kind donations.
